Main Street, New Holland, PA 17557.

Overview:

The 10th Edition of Steve and Susan Zumdahl's widely regarded Chemistry combines a robust conceptual framework, a readable and engaging writing style, and an unparalleled selection of problems and

exercises that make it one of the most trusted chemistry textbooks available today. Chemistry uses a

thoughtful approach built on creative problem-solving techniques and critical thinking. An emphasis on modeling and interactive examples helps students learn how to approach and solve chemical problems --

to think like chemists -- so that they can apply the process of problem solving to all aspects of their lives

Rationale:

Currently, the Garden Spot AP Chemistry course uses the Trivedi Chemistry in a Flask text. This is a flash drive platform created in 2006. The school's subscription has expired and currently students are only able to access PDF documents of the text, excluding AP Chemistry Exam example problems included in the entire version of the text. Additionally, the AP Chemistry Exam was also revised in 2015 to assess students' understanding of big ideas within the subject area through inquiry-based questioning that promotes essential knowledge and continuing understandings, also applying science practices to laboratory and real life scenarios. With this in mind, an updated text that utilizes strategies of problem solving and real-world applications, like the Zumdahl text, would benefit our students in preparation for the AP Chemistry Exam. Lastly, the College Board also provides a list of example textbooks that meet the resource requirements of AP Chemistry and have met or exceed the required alignment to the learning objectives and skills in the course curriculum framework. The Zumdahl text is listed as one of the four exemplar texts for this course.

Features:

- CONCEPTUAL UNDERSTANDING: The text gives students the tools to become critical thinkers, to ask questions, to apply rules and models, and to evaluate the outcome.
- PROBLEM SOLVING: This text talks to the student about how to approach and solve chemical problems, since one of the main goals of general chemistry is to help students become creative problem solvers. The authors emphasize a thoughtful, logical approach rather

than simply memorizing procedures.

- DYNAMIC ART PROGRAM: Most of the glassware, orbitals, graphs, flowcharts, and molecules have been re-drawn to better serve visual learners and enhance the textbook.

8. Reports

a. Lancaster County Tax Collection Bureau

Next Meeting - November 15, 2017 (2018 Operating Budget)

Mr. Ramsey noted that there was no report and the next meeting for the LCTCB would be held on November 15, 2017 to discuss and approve the 2018 operating budget.

b. Lancaster-Lebanon IU13

Mr. Irvin reported on the October 11th IU Board meeting and shared several highlights from the board meeting report: He reported that the IU13 Board approved \$9,809,391.82 in disbursements and approved several new or addition to service contracts for Business

Services, Early Childhood and Special Education Services, Instructional & Technology Services, and Human Resource Services. There were eleven (11) resignations, one (1) termination, four (4) retirements, eighty-five (85) new hires, thirty-one (31) changes in position or salaries, and seven (7) leaves of absence. He distributed to the Board copies of the Fast Facts for the IU13.

c. Lancaster CTC

Mrs. Readman reported that the JOC met on September 28th indicating that they received a presentation from the Foundation with an organization update including information on two upcoming fundraiser events, Taste of Success on March 9, 2018 and Fly on the Run on May 9 & 10, 2018. She also reported that they received a presentation from the Precision Metal program. Mrs. Readman informed the Board that Worley Orbitz was no longer purchasing the tiny house, but instead was proposing a collaboration with the CTC programs to build a STEM house that would be used to teacher green living and renewable energy.

d. Legislative

Mr. Wentzel reported on an update on the state budget indicating that there was still no budget. He also reported on House Bill 44 which adds clarity to the regulation of the number of names a school board member needs to petition to have their name placed on the ballot.

9. Superintendent's Report

Dr. Hollister reported to the Board that two of the District's school psychologist, Caitlin Bennyhoff and Matthew Ferchalk recently co-authored and published an article for the National School Psychologist.

Dr. Hollister updated the Board on the Houston hurricane relief efforts of the School District indicating that nearly 300 backpacks filled with supplies were sent to the partner school district in Houston. He thanked everyone who participated.

Dr. Hollister reported to the Board on the recent event, Manufacturing Day, which exposed students to career skill paths in both technology and manufacturing. He noted that 40 students participated in the exercise.
